4. First aid measures	
Eye contact:	Immediately flush eyes gently with a directed stream of water for at least 15 minutes while forcibly holding eyelids apart to ensure complete irrigation of all eye and lid tissue. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do so. Continue rinsing. Get medical attention immediately.
Skin contact:	Flush skin thoroughly with cool water for at least 15 minutes. Remove contaminated clothing and wash clothing before reuse. If irritation occurs and persists, get medical attention.
Inhalation:	Remove to fresh air. If breathing is difficult, have trained person administer oxygen. Keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. If respiration stops, give mouth-mouth resuscitation. Get prompt medical attention if symptoms develop.
Ingestion:	Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If swallowed, do not induce vomiting. Contact a physician, medical facility, or poison control center for advice about whether to induce vomiting. If possible, do not leave individual unattended. Get medical attention immediately.

5. Fire-fighting measures

Specific methods

Use standard firefighting procedures and consider the hazards of other involved materials. Move containers from fire area if you can do so without risk. Selfcontained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing must be worn in case of fire. In the event of fire and/or explosion do not breathe fumes.

6. Accidental release measures

Personal precautions:

Wear protective clothing as described in Section 8 of this safety data sheet. Keep unnecessary personnel away. Keep people away from and upwind of spill/leak. Keep out of low areas. Eliminate all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks, or flames in immediate area). Wear appropriate protective equipment and clothing during clean-up. Do not touch damaged containers or spilled material unless wearing appropriate protective clothing. Ventilate closed spaces before

entering them. Use appropriate containment to avoid environmental contamination. Transfer by mechanical means such as vacuum truck to a salvage tank or other suitable container for recovery or safe disposal. Local authorities should be advised in significant spillages cannot be contained. For personal protection, see section of the SDS.

Methods for Containment

Eliminate all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks, or flames in immediate area). Take precautionary measures against static discharge. Use only non-sparking tools. Keep combustibles (wood, paper, oil, etc.) away from spilled material. Stop the flow of material, if this is without risk. Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. Dike spill area and cap leaking containers as necessary to prevent further spreading of spilled material. Collect spillage. Absorb spilled liquid with suitable material such as dirt or sand. Prevent entry into waterways, sewer, basements or confined areas.

Methods for Clean-Up

Pick up and transfer to properly labeled containers.

Ventilate the contaminated area. Extinguish all flames in the vicinity. Eliminate all ignition sources if safe to do so. Wear appropriate protective equipment and clothing during clean-up. Should not be released into the environment. Prevent product from entering drains.

Large spills: Stop the flow of material, if this is without risk. Dike the spilled material, where this is possible. Cover with plastic sheet to prevent spreading. Do not allow material to contaminate ground water system. Use a non-combustible material like vermiculite, sand or earth to soak up the product and place into a container for later disposal. Following product recovery, flush area with water.

Small spills: Wipe up with absorbent material (e.g. cloth, fleece). Clean surface thoroughly to remove residual contamination.

Never return spills to original containers for re-use. This material and its container must be disposed of as hazardous waste. For waste disposal, see section 13 of the SDS.

7. Handling and storage

Handling:

Handle in accordance with good industrial hygiene and safety practice. Use personal protection recommended in Section 8. Avoid contact with skin, eyes or clothing. Wash face, hands and any exposed skin thoroughly after handling. Do not

Keep away from heat and sources of ignition. Avoid sparks promoters. Keep container tightly closed and store in a cool, dry and well-ventilated place. Store locked up. Keep from freezing.
